Ohio Man and Wife Die in Plane Crash Near Indy

A Columbus Ohio man and his wife were killed early Tuesday when their small plane crashed on a farm near Wakeland, about 30 miles southwest of Indianapolis.

The Morgan County Sherriff's Department identified the victims as Daniel L. Enyart, 24, and his wife Judith. Deputies said the plane, a Piper Cherokee, left Columbus en route to Marysville, Kansas. The Federal Aviation Administration said the plane was owned by Ellis E. Evans, also of Columbus.

The plane crashed sometime after midnight, and was found on the John Walter's farm Tuesday afternoon, deputies said. The cause of the crash was not immediately known.
