



Sue Ann Clingman Jackson, 35, who taught here in a federal Respite Care program and with her blind husband ran a variety store in the Internal Revenue Service Building in Andover, died Tuesday in Lawrence General Hospital after suffering cancer of the esophagus. Her husband, Norman P. Jackson of Methuen, said his wife "used to take kids out, take care of them, take them places out in society" in the Respite Care program for disabled and retarded children. Mrs. Jackson, a former teacher of students with special needs in the Lawrence and Haverhill schools, worked with Respite for the past year. "It was generous and worthwhile work," her

husband said in an interview yesterday. Born in Columbus, Ohio, she was a graduate of Columbus schools and earned her bachelor's degree at Ohio University. She earned a master's degree at Boston State College in 1974. She had previously worked for Blue Cross-Blue Shield. Mrs. Jackson was active in the First Church Congregational in Methuen and in the Order of the Eastern Star in Methuen where she lived for the past nine years. Besides her husband, she leaves a daughter, Julie Ann Jackson of Methuen; her mother, Helen B. Clingman of Columbus, Ohio; an uncle and two cousins. A funeral service will be held tomorrow at 11 a.m. in the Kenneth H. Pollard Funeral Home, 233 Lawrence St., Methuen. Burial will be in Sunset Cemetery, Alton, Ohio.
